

- Alumni and placement database is also maintained in the softcopies.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

During the beginning of each semester significant topics, other than the prescribed syllabus, are listed out in the staff meeting .The added topics are dealt in the regular classroom teaching through seminar, discussion ,brain storming. Local visit, special lecture etc.

- Institution developed a manual for pre internship and internship programme internship.

- Students are given experiential learning experiences through Preparation of content resource book. PPTs, laboratory manual, question banks, action research, compilation of biographical notes of poets, mathematicians, scientists etc, preparation of teaching modules using software, Local visits, participation in inter and intra college competitions, preparation of TLM etc.
- Collection of weblinks for all the papers .
